Halloween – The Celtic Tradition

Halloween can be traced back to the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain (pronounced Sah-ween). The ancient Celts started their new year on November 1st each year, which marked the end of the summer and the beginning of the dark and desolate winter, a season often associated with death in the pre-Christian world. On October 31st, the night before the new year, the boundary between the living and the dead was believed to blur. Ghosts were allowed to return to the earth! While these spirits caused all sorts of trouble and damaged crops, they also allowed the druids to have prophetic visions and make predictions about the future.

To celebrate, the people would extinguish their hearth fires and gather in large groups. The druids would build large bonfires and people, often costumed in animal skins and heads, gathered to sacrifice crops and animals to the Celtic deities. They would try to predict each others' fortunes and then return to their homes, relighting their hearths with flame from the sacred bonfire.

After the coming of the Roman Empire, two Roman festivals were combined with the festival of Samhain. One of these festivals honored Pomona, the goddess of fruits and trees. The tradition of bobbing for apples was common to this festival and the apple was considered the symbol of Pomona. The other festival was Feralia, where the Romans remembered their ancestors and celebrated the passing of the dead.

Eventually, as with most pagan celebrations, this festival was integrated into Christian society. In the 5th century, Pope Boniface IV created the feast called All Martyrs Day on May 13th. This celebration was eventually moved to November 1st to take over the popular pagan festival. Later, the holiday changed its name to All Souls' Day and All Saints' Day in some areas. In Middle English, the festival was called Alhallowmesse (or All-Hallowmas). The night before it of course because All-Hallowmas Eve (or Halloween).
