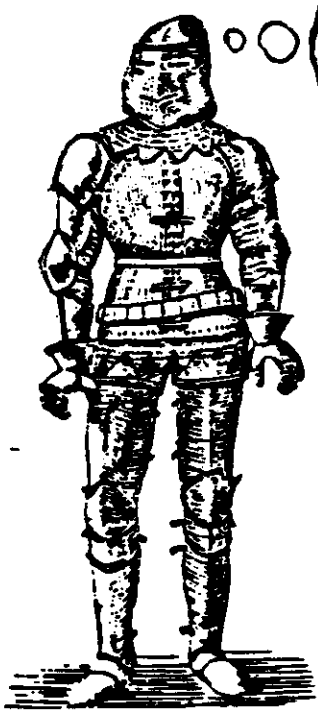

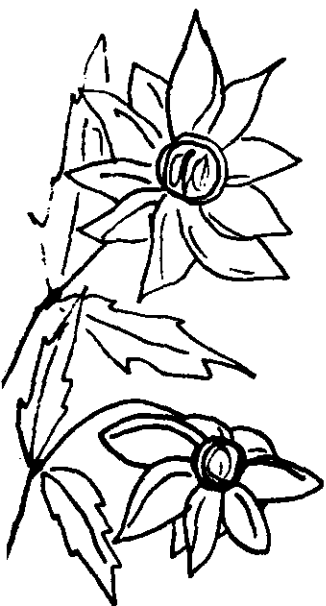
An Admonition to Humble Bees that they may Buzz, So They Sting Not.

THIRD ANNUAL FEAST OF THE THIRTY

OCTOBER 22, 23 & 24

The Canton of Falconree in the Barony of Nottingham Coill invites residents of the Known World to the Third Annual Feast of the Thirty. Festivities will commence on Friday, Oct. 22 and conclude on Sunday, October 24.

Activities include a Grand Melee, Archery Tournament, Masked Ball, dance instruction, chess and backgammon tourneys, indoor and outdoor period games, table setting competition, brewing contest, activities for children, covered space for merchants, organized classes and workshops, orientation for new members and guests, a Feast on Saturday evening, and light breakfasts on Saturday and Sunday.

The site is Camp Buckhorn, the same as last Spring's Crown Tournament. It has cabin space, showers, a small lake and a very nice great hall. To avoid overcrowding at the site limits have been set for both the feast and overnight participation. Early registration is important. The event will be cancelled if there are not sufficient reservations by Oct. 15.

In order to conserve space here, a complete description of the planned event and a registration form has been mailed to each kingdom officer and all seneschal(e)s listed in the Regnum. Further information may be obtained by contacting the autocrat.

We hope to make this an exciting event for fighters and non-fighters, experienced SCAers and newcomers, adults and children and we look forward to your participation.

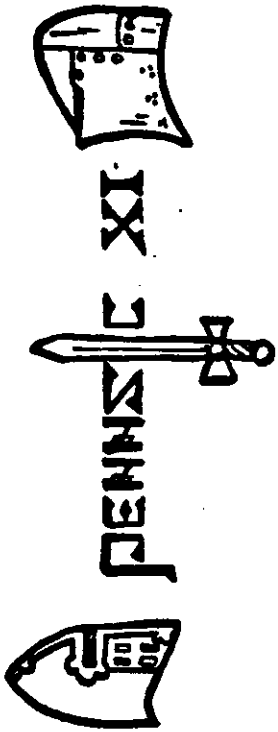

Once again the election calls to all noble fighters to loyally defend their kingdom (or the kingdom of their allies) in honourable battle. Once again the armies of the East and Middle Kingdoms will clash and test their prowess at arms at the Pennsic War the weekend of August 20-22 of A.S. 1011 (1982).

This eleventh annual Pennsic will take place, again, at Cooper's Lake Campground in western Pa. This site has a large amount of camping space, on site parking, a small convenience store, showers, some indoor plumbing, and a generous number of porta-o-castles.

The fees for the entire weekend (Fri.-Sun.) will be \$ 10 per person. This includes a \$ 9.25 camping fee for the Coopers and \$.75 for the SCA. In addition for those who arrive before Friday there is a \$ 2.50 per person per day camping fee. All fees for the length of your stay will be collected when you first arrive. This is different from in the past when you needed to check in twice. All fees will be collected in one place and in cash. Please do not plan on using cheques to cover your fees.

Upon arriving all gentiles (including children) will be required to sign a waiver. A waiver accompanies this announcement. Should you need more than one please send a SASE to the following address and I will be happy to provide you with more. Be sure to circle either combatant or non-combatant. This will make our sorting a lot easier. (Also make sure you fill out both sides of the waiver.)

Once you have checked in you are free to drive along the roads to your selected campsite. Please do not take any vehicles off the marked roads. Park on the side of the roads for the loading and unloading. This particular section is given to a great deal of rain in late July and early August. We ask you to stay on the roads to avoid the problem of trapped vehicles.

Those gentiles desiring to market merchandise from outside of their tents are requested to camp up west to the barn. This area has been designated as chiefly for merchant use (anyone of course is welcome to camp there).

After completing your unloading, please drive, again along the roads, down to the parking area. There you will be directed to the nearest available parking space.

When setting up your campsite please bear in mind a few things. The war is a huge event - please take only as much space as you really need. If you "rope off" your area please affix white cloth strips to your ropes every few feet. In addition the ropes should be no lower than 36" from the ground. It is also a good idea (for safety's sake) to treat tent lines similarly.

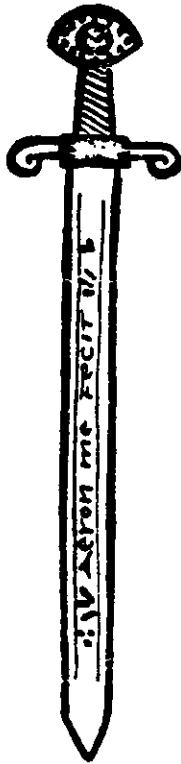

If at all possible keep a fire extinguisher or a bucket of sand or water near your campfires. In the recent past we have had some small amount of trouble with over - zealous campfires.

At several areas around the site a daily schedule will be posted. This schedule will also be posted outside the bath house. Additionally there will be places provided to leave messages. The troll booth will also have an area to post messages.

Bring all lost and found to the troll booth. It will remain there until 5 pm Sunday at which time it will be taken by the autocrat.

If you have any comments, complaints or questions, the autocrat's staff can be recognized by purple and gold armbands. The autocrat will be carrying a 6' staff tipped with purple and gold ribbons. A brief description is as follows: 5' 6", slightly overweight, short red hair, probably wearing male Italian Renaissance. Please feel free to approach the autocrat with any problems or requests. She is, in effect, your host.



There are three major changes in the War this year. Most apparent is THERE WILL BE NO ARMS COMPETITION THIS YEAR. NOTHING WILL BE EXHIBITED FOR JUDGING. Those gentiles wishing to display their arms for the acclaim of the populace may do so in the bath house Saturday afternoon. There will be no formal set-up for this. Space will be allotted on a first come first served basis. Anyone with questions may contact the autocrat.

Second - the barn will be entirely given over to the merchants Friday afternoon and all day Saturday. In the past the traffic inside the barn has become overly congested. This year in order to alleviate this problem, merchants will be set up in orderly rows. There will be set areas for each merchant set up in advance. A space may be reserved by contacting the sub-autocrat (i.e. charge of the merchants area. Her address is given below. Any space not previously reserved will be allotted on a first come first served basis. Any reserved spaces not claimed by noon on Saturday will also be given out on a first come basis. Finally, armour inspection will be done slightly differently this year. There will be no mass inspection. Instead there will be several armour and weapon inspection stations set up throughout the camping areas. These will be clearly designated. It will be the responsibility of the scouts and the fighters to be sure that their armour and weapons have been inspected before the first battles they intend to participate in. Once the equipment has been inspected it will all be marked as passed. Only that armour and those weapons with the passed mark will be allowed to be used. Tape for marking helmets as to which kingdom you may be fighting for, and tape to designate scouts' helmets, will be available at the armour inspection stations.

OTHER MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION:

At the time you check in you will also receive a War Flyer. This will contain a schedule of events, as well as directions to local gas stations, grocery stores and liquor stores.

A class in the fine art of Reticella needle-face will be held on Friday of the Pennsic War. Two sessions will take place in the Bath house. The first will be from 2-4 pm and the second from 6-8 pm. 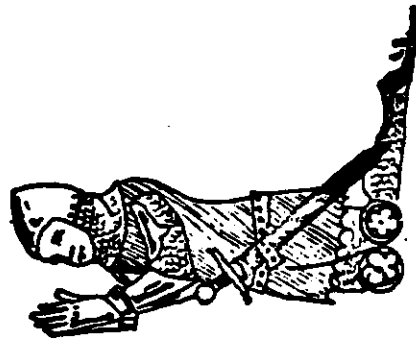

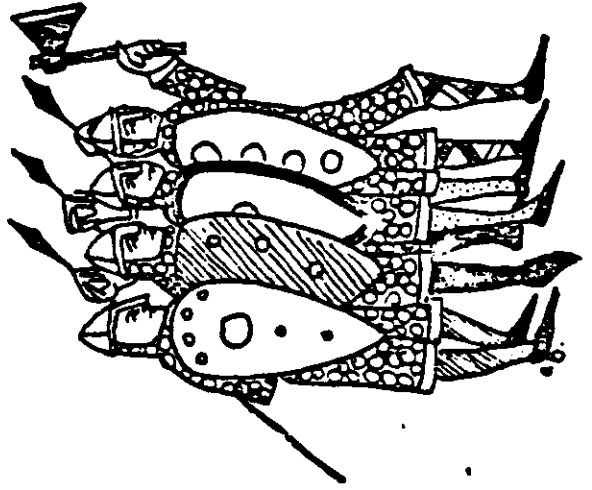
