Costumes can be displayed on mannequins or wooden frames. We shall be providing a P.A. system this year so that our many tallented musicians may be heard. Photo albums of SCA events are always welcome as they permit the public to see something of our activities. Fliers, containing recipes or costume patterns, etc...) could be zeroxed and handed out by the guilds.

What does the SCA stand to gain from all this work and public exposure? Exactly that-PUBLIC EXPOSURE. Some people think of the SCA as a strange religious cult. As usual, the next Guardian Canton meeting is scheduled for the third Morday of the month. The group shall meet at the home of Lord Jason at 7:30 on June 21.

Greetings. By now you should all have received the latest issue of T.I. with the Rules for Heraldic Submissions. Please read them carefully so that you will know and understand the rules by which the College treats submissions. It is the goal of the College of Arms to encourage everyone to register their Society name and a heraldic device, so that everyone will have a unique and protected name and device. Here is a unique opportunity to make a name for yourself that will, after it is registered, be protected from duplication by other members, thereby making that name yours and yours alone.

In order to ensure that your registered name and device are not infringed upon by other members the College had to come up with rules for submissions. As many members are students of history and fiction, the College also makes sure that new members do not accidentally or mistakenly adopt the names or arms of important persons or areas in history or fiction. Were a new member to adopt the name of Richard the Lion Hearted out of respect for that king, he would find that he was the cause of offense to other fans of King Richard who looked upon such a choice as offensive. The College tries to safeguard the enjoyment of the SCA by all its members. The College also tries to do its part in the SCA's quest to recreate the Middle Ages as it should have been, adopting the best of the heraldic practices from the period and trying to maintain a proper level of authenticity in names and device. The new rules are the result of two years of concerted research and debate by the College of Arms. If you have not already submitted your name and device, please use these rules to help you do so. Consult with your local herald for local procedures, submission forms, fees, and advice. While appeals and formal requests for action must go through the Principal Herald, I am always willing to answer questions or to listen to suggestions.

One of the changes we have made in these new rules is the increased importance we have assigned to authenticity in names and devices, in keeping with the growth of the SCA from a medieval social club to a true medieval re-creation society (with some creative anachronisms and a lot of fun thrown in). A number of members who have been in the SCA for several years still have not submitted their names to the College. For some this is because they felt that it took too long to hear back. While this was true in the past the current turnaround is down to six months or less.

Because there has not been as much education on authentic name practices as there should have been, many have chosen names that sound reasonable but are not really authentic. As they have used the name for some time, they feel that they do not wish to change the name and thus they are afraid to submit it because under the new rules it might not pass. As a gesture of goodwill to encourage such people to go ahead and submit their names, I hereby decree a grace period, lasting until the end of September, 1982. During this grace period the College of Arms will give the benefit of the doubt to name submissions with regards to authenticity, asking only that they be compatible with period usage. The other rules on names still hold. After September we will enforce the rules as written, so all who have not done so are urged to take advantage of this opportunity and submit their names—and device.

There seems to have been some confusion over the recent list of proposals from the Board of Directors recently published in the newsletters. These were a collection of proposals sent to me by members of the SCA in response to my previous batch of proposals. Only two of the five proposals (the Crder of Chivalry and the clarification of barons) were mine. The Board had them published so that the populace would have a chance to consider them and send their opinions to the Board. (Many have said they were glad to be consulted.) The last paragraph on the list of proposals was not actually a proposal, but a report on the outcome of several of my earlier proposals concerning how to address a Grant of Arms holder and the use of the word squire. The designations of squire, apprentice and protege were approved for use by the kingdoms as descriptive titles only, not as formal titles of rank. Section VII.B.2. in the Corpora requires that I approve any title not listed in the Corpora. I am therefore gathering together all titles and designations in use in the SCA and approving them. The collected list will then be available as a reference. Rest assured that neither the College of Arms nor I wish to exceed our authority or drastically change the SCA.

I would like to remind all branch seneschals that the Corporar requires all branches to register their name with the College, in order to gain and maintain their status. Branches at or above baronial level must also register arms. Almost half of the branches have not done so, and their status could be therefore endangered. Please consult with your herald so the branch name can be submitted.

Anyone reading this who would like to learn more about what the College of Arms talks about and what my decisions are may subscribe for a year to the monthly letters of acceptances and rejections I send to College of Arms members. To subscribe send to me your name, address, and a check for \$10 made out to the College of Arms, this amount being the actual cost of a year's mailings. (I will give a 20% subsidy to warranted heralds, so they may subscribe for \$8/year.) If you have heraldic questions I and other members of the College are always willing to help answer them. Help us help you by registering your name, device and badge and by letting the heralds know your opinions. Heraldry was a major element of medieval life. I hope it can be a part of yours too.
