

This Month in History



MARCH

In the pre-Julian Roman Calendar March was the first month of the year, but Julian Conse's calendar reforms in 46BC made in the third. To the Romans at was Morrow, named in honour of the god of war and battle, Mars.



- 1 The old Roman New Year's Day, retained after Julis Caeser's calendar reforms only for the computation of Roman Military Service.
- 2 Massacre of the Protestants at Vassy, France in 1562.
- 3 The Swiss defeat Charles the Bold at the battle of Granson in 1476.
- 4 King Henry IV of England deposed in 1461, accession of King Edward IV. Saladin, Muslim Commander & Sultan of Egypt & Syria, died in Damascus in 1193.
- 5 William Oughtred, probable inventor of the slide rule, was born in Eton, Buckinghamshire in 1572.
- 6 Michelangelo Buonarroti, Remaissance painter, poet & sculpter, was born in Italy 1472.
- 7 Feast day of Saint Thomas Aquinas. Antonius Pius, Roman Emperor, died in 161 AD.
- 8 Francesco Sforza, condottiere (soldier of fortune) who fought both for & against Venice, Milan & the Pope; died in Milan in 1466.
- 9 Feast day of Saint Frances of Rome.
- 10 Completion of the re-building of the Temple at Jerusalem after the Jewish captivity in 515 BC. Ferdinand I, Austrian Holy Roman Emperor, was born in 1503.
- 11 Decapitation, used as a formal mean of execution, invented by the Hitties in 2654 BC.
- 12 Feast day of Saint Gregory the Great, Church Father & Pope, died in Rome in 604 AD.
- 13 The Gutenburg Bible goes to press in 1462.
- 14 Peter of Castile was defeated at the battle of Montiel in 1369. In 1590, King Henry of England defeats the League at Ivry (Yures).
- 15 The assassination of Julius Caeser by Brutus & others in Rome in 44 BC. Attilla the Hun sacked his last in 549 AD.
- 16 Tiberius Claudius <u>Nero</u>, Roman Emperor, died at Capri in 37 AD. Edward II defeats the Barons at Boroughbridge in 1322.
- 17 Feast day of Ireland's Saint Patrick, who died in 464 AD. Popularly regarded in the Middle Ages as the day that Noah entered the Ark before the flood.
- 18 Ivan IV (Ivan the Terrible), Tsar of Russia, died this day in 1584.
- 19 The first Eclipse recorded in history, it was Lunar & observed by the Babylonians in 712 BC (according to Ptolemy).
- 20 The Vernal Equinox, the first day of Spring, when day & night are of equal length (or March 21st). Ovid (Publius Ovidus Naso), Latin Poet "The Art of Love" born in 43 BC.
- 21 Eleanor of Aquitaine's marriage to Louis of France is annulled in 1152. Accession of King Henry V of England in 1413.
- 22 The English were defeated by the Scots at Anjou in 1421. King Maximillion I of Germany & Holy Roman Emperor, was born in Austria in 1454.
- 23 Playing cards are first mentioned in writing in Florence in 1377. Queen Elizabeth I of England, died in 1603 at the age of 70.
- 24 Accession of King James I of England (James VI of Scotland), in 1603.
- 25 Feast of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Our Lady's Day) liturgically celebrated in since the 7th century. Accession of Robert I of Scotland in 1309.
- 26 Konrad von Gesner, writer "A Catalogue of Animals" was born in Zurich in 1516.
- 27 Feast day of Saint John Damascene.
- 28 King Wilhelm of Germany, foe of the Hohenstaufens, was killed in a skirmish in Frisia in 1256. Gunpowder was first used in a European battle in 1380.
- 29 The Yorkists defeat the Lancastrians at Towton in 1461.
- 30 Jewish philosopher Maimonides "Guide of the Perplexed" was born in Cordoba, Spain 1135.
- 31 King Francis I of France died in 1547. Philip of Hesse, Landgrave of Hesse, died in Germany in 1567.

DEMO AT STELLARCON XII


Mar 27-29, 1987



SITE: Camp York in the Kings Mountain State Park on the North Carolina-South Carolina state line. It will open at noon on Friday, April 3 and close at noon on Sunday, April 5. We encourage you to arrive on Friday if possible as planned activities begin Saturday morning.

RESERVATIONS AND FEES: On-board reservations include not only a spectacular feast Saturday evening, but also brunch Saturday morning and breakfast Sunday as bonuses at no additional charge. Reservations will be limited to the seating capacity of the feast hall, about 160. All on-board requests will thus be processed first (before any off-board) and must be received by Fri, March 27. Please reserve early.

FEES:

\$14 members, \$15 nonmembers, On-board

\$ 7 members, \$ 8 nonmembers, Off-board

\$ 2 day-trippers. Seat in the feast hall not included.

Children ages 6 - 12 half price, under age 6 free.

Please note that proof of SCA membership <u>must</u> accompany your reservations for the lower fee. Make checks payable to: <u>BARONY OF THE SACRED STONE/SCA INC.</u>
Include: the names (preferably mundane and SCA) of each person for whom you are reserving, a contact farspeaker number in case of any problems, and a SASE if you desire confirmation. Send your reservation material to the Head Autocrat: Baroness Susan Douglas of Andover, c/o Susan Osborne, 1281 Andover Rd., Charlotte, NC, 28211; 704/366-6668. No phone reservations.

Food & Refrigeration: Meals for the weekend will be prepared under the direction of Hindscroft resident Viscount Sir Bryetor Aison of Devon, who achieved fame as a Master Cook in the kingdom of Trimaris. Refrigeration in the kitchen is reserved for the feastcrats. Exceptions: medical and baby formulas only. Please make your own arrangements for perishable items.

Lodging: Camp York is a large wooded campsite with cabins ranging from small 2-person buildings to large lodges with fireplaces. Park rules prohibit tenting. Hot showers are available. The site includes a beautiful lake where swimming is permitted (if you are that brave the first weekend in April). Parents of young children please note-the lake is unfenced and we are not providing lifeguards.

Schedule: The Entertainment Autocrats are devising a challenging quest for Saturday morning. The Last Court of Their Majesties, King Klaus and Queen Cyffaith will begin at 1:00 pm. Coronation ceremonies and entertainments will take place during the afternoon followed by feasting and dancing in the evening.

Entertainment & decorations: The Autocrats are Guardians Erlin (Robby Lang, Rt 2 Box 129, Marshville, NC, 28103, ph. 704/385-9642) and Lady Rachel de Johnstone (Lisa Adams, 6349 Thelo Dr., Charlotte, 28212; 704/563-6595). Everyone is encouraged to bring banners-individual, household, guild, canton, shire, & barony.

Arts & Sciences: The Autocrat is Hawkwood resident Catriona Fergusson, (Deena McKinney, Rt. 1, Box 13, Arden, NC 28704). A large recreation hall will be set aside for the A&S display. Please bring your works; we hope to have a large exhibition for the edification and enjoyment of the populace.

Merchants: You are welcome, but please contact the Merchantcrat to reserve space. She is Lady Deirdre of Hope's Dale (Lindy Hensley, 6982 Oakstone Pl, Charlotte, 28210; 704/554-8806).

<u>Cautions</u>: 1) The site is VERY discretely wet; use of alcoholic beverages is limited to those over 21 years of age. 2) Pets. Well-behaved, leashed pets are welcome. (The <u>owners</u> of animals who disturb other guests will be drowned in the lake.)

DIRECTIONS: From the north, take your best route to I-85 South in NC and continue approximately 40 miles south of Charlotte, just to the NC-SC state line. Take the KINGS MOUNTAIN NATIONAL MILITARY PARK exit. (It is about 5 miles south of the Kings Mountain exit, which you should NOT take). From the south, take your best route to I-85 North at the NC-SC state line and take the same exit. Follow the signs into the park, continue straight into the Kings Mountain State Park and on into Camp York. (Note: This is the same state park where Crown Tournament was held in May of last year, but a different campsite.

ADDENDUM TO CORONATION ANNOUNCEMENT:

For Olaf and Judith's Coronation, the following definitions apply:


On-Board: This fee is for a full participant at the event and includes lodging in a cabin at Camp York, use of all campsite facilities, admission to all scheduled event activities, and meals prepared by the feastcrats.

Off-Board: This fee includes lodging in a cabin, use of campsite facilities,

admission to all event activities, and space in the hall during the feast. NO MEALS are included. It should be especially noted that NO off-board requests will be processed until AFTER Friday, March 27, the deadline for on-board reservations. If space in the hall then remains, requests will be processed based on the date received.

<u>Day-Trippers:</u> This fee is for people who simply wish to witness the "ceremonial" activities and then go home. It includes use of campsite facilities during the day through the First Court of the new monarchs. <u>Neither lodging nor admission to the hall during the feast is included.</u>

One last point. We are happy to reserve a multi-person cabin for a group once we have received the paid reservations for the entire party.


The recent snowfall and near-freezing rain did nothing to dampen the spirits of those hardy souls who attended the Tourney of Ymir on February 28 in Windmaster's Hill. Due to the weather, the autocrats held the entire event inside one enormous hall. At one end was the fighting, separated from the populace by a barrier of tables and skilled marshals, and at the other was the Arts and Sciences exhibition and other activities more gentle than fighting. Mistress Matilda, the Kingdom Minister of Arts and Sciences, was there giving explanations of the MoAS Handbook and giving examples of how to judge competitions effectively and fairly, using actual exhibits. Master Robert de Monte from the East Kingdom was in attendance as well, and displayed a full suit of plate armor he had made completely by hand, down to the buckles. His Lady wife, Mistress Nicola, was with him, and showed a set of playing cards she had woodcut and printed, as well has some of her own fine armoring.

The Tourney itself was preceded by authorization bouts, in which at least one member of our Barony took part. The actual competition was excellent, with many excellent fighters participating, from Dukes, Knights, and Barons to ordinary, yet quite skilled Gentles. In fact, both of Their Majesties, and His Highness all fought in the illustrious lists. In the end, His Majesty emerged victorious, and graciously awarded his prize to Lord Otto the Obscure, who greatly impressed His Majesty by his Chivalry, Honor, and Skill.

During the Court of Their Majesties, several offices changed hands and announcements were made. Of special interest, though, was the mention of members of our Barony. As mentioned elsewhere in this issue, both Bran Trefonin, the Seneschal of the Guardians of the Sacred Stone and recent Companion of the Order of the Sacred Stone, and Stephen Badger, a Guardian native who also attends Windmaster functions, were Awarded Arms by His Majesty. In addition, and not mentioned elsewhere, Aaron the Forester, a Guardian newcomer at his first event, won the Backgammon competition held during the day!

The feast was quite varied, from date and sausage balls to cheese and onion tarts, beef in a wine broth, and pork pastry. After the feast was over, the tables were cleared and dancing began. It started slowly at first, with only a few dancers, but eventually many more joined in until dancing space was at a premium. Hole in the Wall, the Maltese Bransle, and Toss the Duchess were among the dances performed, to the accompaniment of Lord Eldrid Tremayne and his recorder.

At day's end, everyone returned to private thoughts and found what place they could to retire. A good time was had by all and good feelings went with them to their destinations.
