Barony of the Sacred Stone Regular Member's Meeting

The Sacred Stone Baronial Meeting for the Month of July was held at Town Creek Park in Salisbury on July 23, 2006. In attendance were Their Excellencies Marc and Alianor, Baronial Seneschal Robear, Mistress Jessamyn, Baron Achbar, Miriel, Muireann, Sara of Hindscroft, Aelfwyn, William of Hindscroft, Mari and Gisela.

Like a blessing from the Heavens, the rain ceased about 1 pm and the meeting commenced about ten minutes later called to order by Robear who pointed out the list of events taking place in the late summer and early fall within the barony's borders. He noted that the populace of Sacred Stone were both industrious and would likely be very busy until after War of the Wings but that he was very glad to have the activities in this region.

Knights Marshal, Rapier Marshal, Minister of Arts and Sciences, Mistress of the Lists and Youth Combat Marshal sent no reports.

Archery Marshal – Miriel reports that Storm is in charge of archery for Flight of the Falcon and Coronation. Things are progressing well for these events. He also stands ready to assist with other events in the region.

Chronicler - Katerina was out of town. There was no report but meeting notes were taken by Gisela.

Chatelaine – Achbar reported that recent conversations have brought home the fact that Newcomers' Points are very important and he is committed to ensuring they are set up and stocked with Gold Key items at every event possible. To this end he states that he has garb for ladies of about Oddney's cut as she graciously donated quite a bit of her excess garb for newcomers' use. Achbar asks for donations of Tunics for both men and women of various sizes that can be used to make new folks feel a part of any event's activities.

Baron Marc agreed and stated, "Everyone has garb they don't wear anymore. It's a great idea to have a tote with a couple of tunics and belts for people to use."

Web Minister – Robear reported that Bonnie has sent updates for Coronation and expects to have the site updated weekly.

Canton Reports followed.

Aire Faucon sent no report.

Baelfire Dunn – Azza sent a report to Robear which he relayed. Azza is stepping down as seneschal at the group's September meeting when Godfrid will take the office. Bridget will assume the duties of A&S Minister at that meeting as well.

Charlesbury Crossing – Robear reported he is set to autocrat Kingdom 12^{th} Night with Mistress Jessamyn as co-autocrat... which fact he informed her of at that moment. Achbar volunteered to assist in any way possible.

Miriel reported that she's worked out a cooperative A&S effort with Aire Faucon. The groups meet at Mistress Jessamyn's home on the third Wednesday of each month for a variety of A&S projects. Anyone is welcome to attend these gatherings and should contact Jessamyn or Miriel for information.

Crois Brigte – Gisela reported things are on track for Sacred Stone Baronial Birthday. The group intends to host Fools' Twelfth Night in January at St. Timothy's Episcopal Church in Winston-Salem. Also the group intends to bid for a Kingdom University in the Winter or Spring.

Also the paperwork to expand the canton's borders to include Davie, Surry, Wilkes and Yadkin counties has been filed and seems to be moving through the system. Robear reiterated that the barony stands poised to support this growth in whatever way it may.

Hindscroft – Sara reported several people have expressed interest in filling vacant offices recently. She then deferred to Aelfwyn, the group's exchequer, who reported that Wastelands made a profit of \$739. Robear congratulated the group for a successful event. Because we are a barony, he said, it is good and right that folks from different groups come together to support each others' events. Wastelands was a good example of this.

Muireann reported the group has two potential demos coming up and will post the information when it is set so others can help if possible.

Salisbury Glenn – Mari reported the Dessert and Dance Revel went very well, a point others present agreed heartily with. The group would like to host another such event, perhaps before Christmas and expand the Dessert aspect to include finger foods as well since people seemed to be 'desserted out' by the end of the event.

Mari will also be autocratting All For One in the spring. Further, she reported the group's demo went very well.

Robear, referring to her comment about another DDR before Christmas, agreed this would be a nice thing . . . expanding on that, Alianor and he both said a baronial holiday gathering for fun would be desirable, which all at the meeting agreed to.

Old Business:

SSBB - Gisela reported that preparations for baronial birthday are moving along well. Money to provide the required insurance for equestrian activities at both SSBB and War of the Wings has been requested. Gise asked about receiving front money for the event and will send an e-mail to Robear and Lidia to make a proper request.

Robear emphasized the importance that all reservation money received for baronial events be deposited within 10 days.

He also made an announcement that Mistress Benefse will conduct a class for exchequers at Coronation. He plans to take this class and encourages all canton seneschals and exchequers to take advantage of it, as well.

Coronation – Robear reports plans for Coronation are "putting right along." He requested that anyone able to come to the site on Monday for clean up, please do. Clean up is very understaffed, he said.

Flight of the Falcon – Robear stated, and many at the meeting agreed, that this event is a very good event for newcomers to be brought to.

New Business:

Gisela asked if the barony would be interested in hosting the Known World Heraldic and Scribal Symposium 2008. She and Rozsa have agreed to work as co-autocrats for the event which is chosen based on a competitive bid process. Laurel Queen of Arms and her College of Arms decide between submitted bids. It was agreed that the barony would support the preparation of a bid for this event which would be subject to the Event Financial Committee before being submitted.

Marc took this opportunity to mention that the Baronial archives of scroll blanks is running dangerously low. He asked that any scribes interested in helping to replenish it, please do so.

Alianor reported that a friend of hers from Windmaster's Hill is willing to come to Sacred Stone to help in creating a Scribal Guild after Pennsic. Any scribes interested in participating or who want more information should contact Her Excellency after war.

Next Meeting – Since many people are engaged in getting ready for Pennsic, Flight of the Falcon, Coronation and Baronial Birthday, it was decided the next Baronial Meeting will be held on Sunday, Sept. 10 at the Elchenburg Castle site after Baronial Birthday.

Pick-up Techniques for Tabby Weaving - Lady Annora Hall

Who said tabby weaving is boring??? Learn the basics of pick-up. All skill levels are welcome. Some experience with narrow warp-face weaving will enable you to get more out of the class. I will review simple patterns taken from the Manesse Codex, history of pick-up, and creating your own patterns. Auditors are welcome.

Tricks of the Trade

Every good archer has a few tricks of the trade they use to improve their ability to hit what they aim at. I'm going to share a few of my favorites here.

In the SCA we typically shoot at known distances – 20, 30, 40 yards. While the rules state that we can not use sights they do not rule out range marks. Range marks are simply marks on your upper limb for the set distances. To get your range marks, get a very small piece of tape and put it on your upper bow limb. Shoot some arrows at a target 20 yards out. The objective is to have the tape spot horizontal to the target center. If your arrows go left or right, don't worry about it now. The objective is to set the spot on the bow limb such that if the bow is held with the mark horizontal to the target center and you release, your arrow hits on the horizontal line of target center. Now move out to 30 and 40 yards and repeat. Realize that these marks will be accurate for the day you set them. Wet, humid, cold, hot days the air density changes and the range marks will change. But now you have a starting point. Sight down the arrow, line up the horizontal range mark, release, score 5 points. At least that's the concept!

The next trick is to mark your best arrows. First number all your arrows. Then shoot them at the target aiming at the target center. Do not correct your technique if the arrows don't hit center. Chart where each arrow hits. Repeat until you have shot each arrow about 10 – 15 times. You will begin to see a pattern. Some arrows go high, some low, some left, some right. I put a black ring just ahead of the nock on the arrows that most consistently hit target center. Hopefully out of a dozen arrows you'll get six that are accurate. Use these six for scored rounds.

One of my favorite archery exercises is shooting at unknown distances. I use a Styrofoam block about 8 inches square. I start with the block at 20 yards. The objective is to put four arrows in the block (more than four and I start splitting arrows). The beauty here is only the first shot is at a known distance. After you hit the block it flies back to some unknown distance.

Stumping is when you walk through an area with a friend. Each of you see something then challenge the other to hit it, leaf, branch, trash, whatever. It's best to arm yourself with arrows fixed with blunt tips and painted a very bright color so they are easier to find.

There are two things that are challenging in speed rounds, getting the arrow on the string and coming to aim quickly. I practice the coming to aim part by putting the arrow on the string, hold the bow down, draw hand fingers in the grip position. Taking my time, I then concentrate on the target and in one smooth, quick movement, raise the bow, draw and release. Getting the arrow on the string quickly takes practice. You should be able to do it without looking, I can't just yet. However, I also see archers on the line holding the arrow in the middle of the shaft, trying to nock the thing. Please! Grab the arrow by the nock, then your fingers will guide the arrow onto the string. It makes little difference if the cock vane is away from the bow or on the bow side. Feathers compress nicely and result in little kick of the arrow. It's better to get an extra arrow or two off scoring a point or five than one less arrow. I prefer a side or ground quiver for speed rounds so I can grab the arrows by the nock. If I'm using a back style quiver I just grab the fletches and nock the arrow.
