I've had a few people talk to me about the length of the meetings and I wanted to make my philosophy known to all of you, my friends. We come together once a month from across a geographically large and demographically diverse barony. 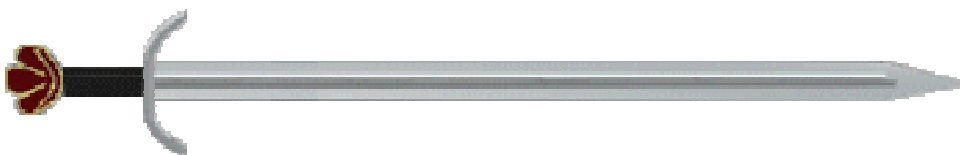

# Getting to Know Your Barony

## *Axel of Tavastia*

**SCA Name:** Axel of Tavastia

**Modern Name:** Wayne Remes

### **Persona's time period and location?**

Roughly 1070s Scandanavia & Europe

### **Persona's story:**

Axel was born in Tavastia a province of Finland in 1050. He found little adventure in his homeland, and when he heard of a great army forming in 1066 to right a great wrong he travelled to Norway and sailed with herald Hardraada to England. Fleeing the aftermath of Battle of Stamford Bridge, he fled into Scotland and then to Ireland where he lived as a Mercenary. Later he returned home to Finland found it just as boring as he remembered it. He met up with a band of Swedes heading into Russia and raiding down the Russian rivers to Constantinople. Upon reaching Constantinople he joined the Varangian Guard and served with distinction in Italy. While fleeing the disastrous "Battle of Durrazzo" (In Italy) he was cornered in a stand of woods by a Norman knight named Knarlic. Axel put up such a spirited resistance that Knarlic asked if he would like to enter his service. Axel, of course, said yes. Axel served as a squire for several years and was eventually knighted by Richard FitzGilbert.

### **What are your interests in the SCA?**

I am interested in heavy fighting, youth combat, rapier, and making sure everyone is having a good time and dance.

### **What brought you to the SCA?**

I was always interested in the idea of Knights and Warriors in historical/fantasy settings. I read a lot of fantasy books in high school and college. I always liked fantasy and action hero movies..and of course the SCA is one of the ways to more or less be one. I was recruited from the Ft Bragg Wargaming club in 1981. I was actually more interested in wargaming, roleplaying and the martial arts at the time I found the SCA, and was kinda dragged into the SCA. Interestingly enough I was not the only person recruited out of the Ft Bragg Wargaming club in 1981. # **Nomadic Looms for the SCA (Part 3)**

### **Cheaters Ground Loom using a rigid heddle**

Modern Rigid Heddle looms are experiencing an upsurge in popularity at this time due to their ease and portability. A wooden bar with slots and sticks with holes in it allows the weaver to raise or lower the shed simply by raising or lower the rigid heddle then using the rigid heddle to beat the weft into place. This allows the weaver to skip the process of creating a heddle rod with a continuous string heddle and the use of a fork or a sword beater. Rigid heddles in a smaller form have been found within the SCA time period i are still in use in Northern Europe by the nomadic Sami people to create stunningly intricate woven belts and trim.

If the weaver wishes to use the form of a ground loom but to avoid the process of a heddle bar a stand alone rigid heddle can be used. Repeat the process of figuring your warp and creating your warp chain but this time hold the cross in your left hand and thread each warp thread into either a slot or a hole of the rigid heddle. When you have pulled 6 or so threads thru the heddle tie a simple over hand knot to secure them. When you finish warping the heddle you will have a warp that you can then tie onto the warp beam or back dowel rod of your ground loom. Tie it to the back pair of stakes. Next take the warp in hand on the front of the rigid heddle and pull it towards you while using the rigid heddle to comb the warp. Tie your warp to evenly to the breast beam or front dowel rod and then put in the two front ground stakes and affix the dowel rod to them with string, yarn, or even reusable zip ties.

This loom includes a tripod which is actually meant for a traditional ground loom and has no function in this photo. The intricate yurt band in the background is the type produced in Central Asia on ground looms. Tensioning is very important and if you find that some of your warp is not as tight as it should be you may either retie that section of warp on the warp beam or hang weights on the offending warp threads. On this loom you can see the rigid heddle in use instead of the traditional heddle rod. At my side is the sword beater that can be used to beat down the weft if I choose not to use the rigid heddle. Using eBay used rigid heddles can be purchased for as little as \$10 or the weaver can choose to buy a new one for under \$35. These heddles can be used within a frame at a later date or for a backstrap loom.

### **Converting your ground loom into a Backstrap Loom**

If you wish to continue working on your weaving inside or somewhere where you cannot pound in stakes but can tie off one in you can easily convert your ground loom into a Backstrap loom. According to Eric Broudy's "The Book of Looms" the backstrap loom has many names and can be found not only in South and Central America but in China, Korea, Tibet, Burma, India, Malaysia, Indonesia, and northern Japan. Because the loom itself is made simply of sticks it would be impossible to determine if Central Asian nomads used it unless, like in South America, actually pieces of weaving were found intact on the loom. However, there is evidence in China dating from around 206 B.C. to 8 A. D. of its use in the form of bronze loom pieces (Broudy, p. 76) and it's depictions on artifacts.

To convert your recently made ground loom of either type simply take rope or cord woven bands to use to make ties. On the warp beam you may make a slip knot and place it over one end of the rod, then measure off a length of your cord and make a knot in the center, then take an equal amount and make another knot to slip over the opposite end of the rod. Open your door and place the center knot on the other side of it then shut it firmly. I use the top of my door or tie the center knot around a door handle or even a small tree or fence post. You can also make the knot permanent and use a carabiner to attach to something secure. Next take another length of band or rope and repeat the process but leave out the central knot. You'll be using your bottom or lower back to tension the loom so sit down comfortably and slip the first end of the cord onto the breast beam then around your body and then tie it off tightly on the opposite side of the beam. Now you have a basic backstrap loom and are ready to begin weaving. This setup is very versatile and can be used on your front porch, in your living room, or anywhere you can find somewhere to tension your warp. It is also possible, though not probable, that you can sit with your legs outstretched before you and tension the loom with your feet! Also you can create a hybrid loom by keeping the two back stakes of the ground loom while adopting the backstrap of the backstrap loom.

### **Commercially available inexpensive portable looms**

Weaving as a craft is currently experiencing resurgence with the major loom and spinning companies such as Schacht, Kromski, and Beka cornering the market in producing small, portable looms aimed for both the beginner weaver and the more experienced weaver searching for something portable and inexpensive. According to Vicountess Seelie, an archeological graduate student mundanely, the rigid heddle looms currently on the market are the closest to approximating the weave structure produced by the Warp Weighted loom. Rigid heddle looms, like the ground loom and backstrap loom, produce narrow width fabric which is appropriate for rectangle construction of tunics and dresses.

Frame looms provide a simple method for weaving and can be made or purchased and set up with multiple heddle bars for the weaving of more complex fabrics. Schacht produces a frame loom that can hold up to four heddle bars for weaving twills but is actually proposed for weaving tapestry. The main draw back to these types of looms is that the length of warp produced is constrained to roughly double the length of the frame as it is warped in a continuous method and the warp is advanced by pulling the warp around the frame in relation to the heddle bars.

Creating simple or complex fabrics to use for garb in the SCA can be an inexpensive and simple pursuit and a wonderful goal to help add authenticity to our game. Please think of the process of weaving your own fabric not in terms of how much time you spend on the project but the added value of actually experiencing and gaining a visceral understanding of the weaving process and creation of clothing which was such a massive part of our ancestors every day.

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# **Maids-of-Honor**

A recipe by THLady Amarath Jean yr Raven

A- English Legend: Anne Boleyn, lady-in-waiting (maid-in-waiting) created this tart, and it was a favorite of King Henry VIII.

B- Tart (pie) with filling of almond, curd cheese and lemon.

C- 1- 8 inch pie shell, prebakes about 8-10 minutes  
DO NOT Brown.

1 T. sugar

1/4 c. Butter

1/3 c. sugar

3- eggs

2/3 c. finely ground Almonds

Almond slivers to decorate

1 c. curd cheese (ricotta or cottage cheese)

Zest grated from a lemon

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
2. On cooled pie shell, sprinkle 1 T. sugar
3. In bowl, blend Butter, sugar. Beat in curd cheese and eggs. Fold in zest and ground Almonds. Spread over pie shell. Arrange Almond slivers around the edge 2 or 3 overlapping.
4. Bake 30-40 minutes; until golden.

D- Lemon Topping (like lemon curd)

1 egg, beaten

2/3 c. sugar

2-3 t. Lemon zest

1 t. cornstarch (or Arrowroot)

3 T. Lemon juice

1 T. sweet butter

1. In pot, low heat, constantly stirring, blend all ingredients until dissolved and thickened. Cool at room temperature.
2. Avoiding Almond slivers, spread Lemon topping over the Tart's top.

## March Business Meeting

### 1:12 meeting started

Introductions

**Seneschal:** Gulf Wars was great. 20 Atlantians attended. Doubghall became Marc's man at arms. Gise awarded Golden Dolphin. Axel offered Logan his weight in beer to fight for us instead of Black Diamond at WoW. Logan's response had to do with Egill's weight in beer...

**Exchequer:** Books are balanced; Doomsday is in. No funds are currently encumbered save \$100 for Kingdom Archery and \$100 for Baronial Unevent. Approximately \$2k will be needed for WoW. As of the close of March 2009, the baronial checkbook featured a balance of \$10,495.48. Please note, however, that the March bank statement has not yet arrived, so any March deposits (by anyone other than me) may not be reflected in this balance. The checks due from this balance are those dedicated during the March baronial business meeting, being the storage unit and list fence, and \$120.03 to Baron Axel of the prior-balance \$150 dedicated to the baron/baroness travel fund.

Finally, the first quarterly report for 2009 is under construction. It's due during April.

**Chronicler:** Gise publicly commended the chronicler for doing a great job with the office.

**Chatelaine:** The boxes are still at Meg's. Ommari wants info as deoms start so that we can coordinate them better. Chatelaine needs to update letter on website.

**Web Minister:** Regnum has been updated. Please check your data. Canton regnums are also there. Baronial Champions data is needed. Site has been moved to new Kingdom server; Maeve thanks Tal for making it happen.

**MoL:** Not present; Gise says 'we need more folks to become MoLs.' Geffrei is no longer the Regional MoL.

**Herald:** Has some donations of books from Tal. Has presented a list of requests, requested \$150 for them. The quartermaster will maintain a quarterly inventory of the Baronial Heraldic Library along with other inventory. There was lots of discussion about the use of the books, and what to buy. Gise will discuss what is needed with Niccolina. Possibility of using the Regional Libraries? Requested \$50/yr for maintenance of office. Moved by Nuala, second by Andreas. Unanimously approved. Would like to create a local OP and Armorial. Please send Niccolina your registered armory. Middlegate and Crois Brigitte already have their members' registered arms on their website.

**Knights Marshal:** Kingdom is revamping the marshallate laws due to issues in current wordings; please stay tuned. Achbar is now a Combat Archery Marshal trainer.

**MoAS:** Lidia is the new MoAS. She also won the KASF Baronial Championships. Amarath took Jewel of the Mountain and Lidia took Glory of the Mountain and Best in Show at Hidden Mountain Baronial Birthday's A&S.

Asked for \$100/yr budget for supplies. It was unanimously approved much later in the meeting once we realized that a vote had not been taken; see further down. A lot of conversation about stipends and budgets ensued. Robyn asked that an annual review be part of the standard procedures. Nuala believed that any office with a budget or stipend should do an independent report and reconcile with the Exchequer.

The Heralds Office has requested MoAS oversee the making of tabards and baldrics as the existing ones cannot be found.

**Chirurgion:** Gwynwilfe has been deployed. She encourages folks to make use of her office.

**Baronial Policies:** A draft rewrite of the Baronial Policies was handed out by Rozsa - see attached - and discussed. Comments are requested and should go to Rozsa, Kisaiya. Gise requested commentary in public on the E-List if people were able but wants the commentary in any way that folks are comfortable with. Gise thanked Rozsa and Kisaiya for their work.

**Storage Unit vote:** Quotes presented for 5 units. After some discussion, Tal moved that we use Olympic Crown Storage in Salisbury, \$1320/2 yrs 10x10 24hr access. Seconded by Ommari, passed with one abstention. Items must be moved by end of April. Tal will organize getting it done as Quartermaster.
