- c. Need bids for Birthday. SG is working no one.
- d. Unevent happening June 1st @ Star of Bethlehem. Aine is running it.
- e. Still need the quote for fixing the big pavilion. Mari agreed to get the information.
- f. Selling the old 16x20 pavilion was previously approved. Need to set a sales price. Master Talorgen offered \$250.00 for the tent.

Vote on selling to Tal AS IS for \$250.

17/0/3 vote.

Sale approved. Tal will get with Mari to take care of it.

- g. Allocation of Funds.
- 1. Continued allocation of baronial cookware fund: 18 for/ 0 against/0 abstain. Maintained.
- 2. Pennsic Children's Fete: Suggested we provide same as last year \$300: 19 for/0 against/1 abstain. Maintained. Robert will take on Fete feeding responsibility again. We now include the whack a knight watering in planning, instead of allowing to remain a point of contention. They need their own cooler but can provide water and ice.
- 3. Newcomers Fund/Chatelaine's office use: \$333.30, funded largely by donation from Baelfire Dunn. Voted to continue: 19 for/0 against/0 abstain. Maintained.
- 4. Officer budgets: \$50 per office, with \$100 for seneschal and exchequer and coronet. Voted to continue: 18 for/0 against/0 abstain. Maintained.
- 5. Baronial Hospitality: \$1000/year set forth. Voted: 19 for/0 against/0 abstained. Maintained.
- 6. Sacred Stone to sponsor pay pal fee for Known World Ag. It was moved that we agree to fund no more than \$200. If that is not enough, we can discuss again. Vote: 19 for/0 against/1 abstain. Carried.
- h. Note from Seneschal: Please remember that the Barony previously agreed we would not be providing any infrastructure for War of the Wings. If you hear different, please have that person contact our Seneschal.
- i. Chair replacement, as previously discussed we need two additional chairs to provide should guest or the Crown come to events. It was previously agreed that this could be done. It was moved that we agree to pay Master Talorgen no more than \$100.00 for the chairs. Master Talorgen agreed to build said chairs at cost of materials. Suggestion forward and approved.
- j. Cleaning out baronial storage shed, workday, and April meeting: Last weekend in April, 27th. Mari and Giovanni will organize. Event on Facebook to be created. Giovanni just agreed to become the quartermaster as long as he is not the drop dead deputy for the Exchequers office. That was agreed.

  What is the process? Demo policy brought up by
  Chatelaine (Kisaiya). Before holding a demo: A
  demo must be approved by the hosting group in order for the SCA name and heraldry to be used.
  Someone must be coordinator and make a plan for
  demo, just like we do events. Quality demos are the
  goal.

There is not a set rule as to which group must approve. So a Canton or a Barony or a Shire can approve one. It just needs to be approved

#### **LUNCH**

Lunch will consist of a dayboard of meats, cheeses, olives, and breads with a selection of soups (French onion, Lentil, etc.) We plan to hold lunch costs to \$3 per person and charge \$5 per person. The profits will split between the kingdom travel fund and regalia fund. We will attempt to get lunch reservations in order to plan accordingly, but we will base lunch plans based on 40 people.

#### **DESCRIPTION OF LINCOLNTON CULTURAL CENTER FOR EVENT PURPOSES:**

#### **PARKING**

14 slots in parking lot behind the building. Good place for staff.

40+ slots in bank across main street, plus 20+ slots in post office catty-corner across main street, and another 15+ slots in bank across side street

#### **CENTRAL LOCATION**

Just over one mile from Hwy 321 – located halfway between I-40 and I-85. Charlotte is 1 hour away and Greensboro is 2 hours away.

#### **OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES**

None. Absolutely no room for fighting on the very small lawn.

#### **ACCESSIBILITY**

Elevator goes to all floors, including half steps of floors, so even though much of the building has steps they can be avoided through elevator usage.

#### **BATHROOMS**

Small bathrooms on first and second floor plus large, accessible bathrooms big enough to change in off the reception hall.

#### GATE (1st floor)

1<sup>st</sup> floor main entrance off side road has perfect troll entrance. But the main visible entrance is up a big set of stairs. Signs will be needed.

#### KITCHEN (1st Floor)

Has sink, two medium refrigerators, two warming tray "ovens", but no real ovens or stoves. Has a great serving/buffet area. 2<sup>nd</sup> floor has a small kitchenette with small fridge and 2<sup>nd</sup> sink

#### **RECEPTION HALL (1st Floor)**

Large room with tables for gathering and eating. Tile floor, Buffet area of kitchen for easy serving buffet style.

#### ATRIUM (1st Floor)

An off-to-the-side area with tall windows giving lots of light. Perfect for an A&S display

#### **CLASSROOM 1 ART GALLERY**

This well-lit display space can seat 20 or more. This will be fiber arts classroom

## PERFORMANCE HALL (2<sup>nd</sup> floor)

Wonderful acoustics. No food or drink allowed. Seats hundreds. This will be our performing arts classroom. This would also be the site for court.

#### GREEN ROOM (2<sup>nd</sup> floor)

The green room attached to the auditorium will be the royal or baronial room for preparing for court.

## **HOSPITALITY (2<sup>nd</sup> floor)**


Small room across from green room. Can seat about 6. Good for a small activity or one-on-one stuff, like an kingdom exchequer needing private meetings.

#### **REHEARSAL HALL**

Very large room with a slightly raised stage and hardwood floors. Room for up to 60 people. This room has a projector and screen. This will be our classroom for Art of War

#### **COMMUNITY ROOM**

Large classroom with space for 40 people. Room has a projector and screen. Hardwood floors. This will be our hard arts classroom.



## Demos: A Down and Dirty Guide for Anyone Planning a Demo

## Legal stuff:

Demos are a great way to get noticed and attract people to the SCA. However, there are a few Items to think about before you agree to host one or start planning one.

Please note that the SCA and Atlantia have rules about demos. Make sure that you have read these before you even start talking to anyone about a demo!! Here is the major one for you to know:

In order to be covered by SCA Insurance, demos must be approved by the sponsoring Group's Seneschal and a branch may restrict who may represent them to the public.

At any demo, a paid SCA member must be present and in charge of the demo.

Chapter 3 of the Atlantian Chatelain's Handbook which is available online has all these rules (and more!) and some great suggestions about demos. It is very useful.

Also please note that many cities and business have specific rules about public gatherings and events. Make sure you know who to contact for permission before setting up somewhere.

## That being said, let's talk demos!

First, you need to know what kind of demo you need/are being asked to do/want to do. Ultimately all demos are a way to get the society's name out to the public. However each demo will have its own audience and purpose. If you understand this purpose, it is easier to hold a successful demo.

## Types of demos:

**Recruitment:** This the most obvious kind of demo. We go out to the public and try to convince folks to join. The purpose of these demos should be to show the public what we are; NOT to pressure them into joining us.

<u>Where:</u> These can be held anywhere (within the local laws and common sense please). <u>What:</u> Bring out the show. These demos are a chance to show folks what we are made of. This is the time for all the pomp and circumstance. You want people to look and say ahhhhh. Plan a good variety of activities that show the wide range of opportunities and fun that is available. Have color and variety to draw the public interest.

**PR/Community Relations**: This type of demo is to let your local group show people that the SCA is here and is a group of good people. This does not necessarily need to be an in your face kind of demo. The goal of this kind of demo is to leave people saying nice things about the SCA. So you could provide entertainment for a pre-established event; participate in a charity or community activity; or just be a positive presence in the community.

Where: Again, this could be anywhere but often you see these held at movie theaters, restaurants, charity events, or city festivals.

<u>What:</u> This is the demo where you must be aware of the limits of the activity first. Know what the event organizer's expectations are. Know what the is acceptable based on the type of activity you are participating in. You might not need the color and the pomp or you might need to blow it out of the ballpark.

**Educational:** This type of demo is one where the goal is to teach the public about a part of history. Usually, we are invited to do this kind of demo at a school or local event (think library). This is a demo that needs to be oh so accurate and age-appropriate. Make sure your activities are hands on, so people can try new things. The goal here is to inspire interest in history and enjoyment in learning

by providing an interactive experience. Make it fun but make it authentic.

Where: Often these are at schools, libraries, or businesses.

<u>What</u>: This kind of demo requires a little more supervision. As the organizer you need to know what kind of lesson the organizer is teaching and ensure that your activities are appropriate for topic and age. Overseeing this kind of demo can be harder but also really rewarding.

**Acquisitional:** This demo is one that is held to get a specific item, whether it is a site, funding, etc. This kind of demo will contain elements of one of the above demos. Again, this one will require a good understanding of purpose and limitation.

Where: Could be any place but often at camp sites or parks.

<u>What</u>: Based on the location and the organizer's intent. The goal here it to impress and show that we are good people. Know the expectations and limitations of the area and the event.

Misc. notes and ideas: Demos can be held anywhere and are a great way to get attention. Be creative when thinking about where you can hold a demo. Businesses with medieval themes, movie theaters and playhouses, local city events and festivals; schools; and libraries are often our targets but there are many more options out there. You could offer to teach classes; you could participate in local charities; you could donate services to local groups or charities; you could perform in retirement homes; hold a feast; etc. Use your imagination.

Also remember that fighter practices, art nights, and even meetings when held in a public place are demos of a sort. Anywhere we gather in large numbers, people are interested, so always be prepared to answer questions.

**DEMO IN A BOX**: It is useful for your local group to have a basic supply box for demos. While each demo is individual, there are some things you will always need. Print out the handouts available on the SCA web site and keep copies available. Help your chatelaine get business cards and have them ready to hand out. Make a group photo album that showcases local people doing cool things. Have a banner for your local group. If you have some basic items always in reserve, it makes it easier when you do have the opportunity to do a demo.

Make sure you plan your demo fully. Once you have identified the purpose of the demo, think about the activities that best support the event. Know who your site contact is. Get your volunteers early and staff it like you would an event. Pre-plan as much as possible:

Will you need tables, chairs, tents, coolers, etc? Who will provide them? Who will set them up and take them down?

What jobs will need to be filled (marshal, MOL, chiurgeon, etc)? Who will that be?

Will you need a press person? Talk to your seneschal about SCA media rules.

Are the activities planned realistic in the needed number of participants? Reasonable for the age range of attendees? Meet local and SCA rules?

Remember that during the organization process your host is making a judgment about our group. If you are unorganized and scattered, that is what they will remember. If you throw something together at the last minute and it is messy and chaotic, that is what people will remember. Think about the image you are presenting to the public

Attending a Demo: If you are attending a demo please remember you are on display. Your group might have a chatelaine but it is still your responsibility to be a chatelaine for the day. If someone asks a question, answer in a friendly manner. If you do not know the answer, find someone who does. Don't ignore people or fob them off on someone because "it is not your job". At a demo, that is everyone's job.

Be on your best behavior. People can pick up on drama half a mile away. No one will be impressed by a group that is full of in-fighting or full of disasters. If you don't feel like being on public display or you cannot be nice, do not come to the demo.

Make sure all your gear and your garb look tidy and nice. Demos are a time to show people what we can do at our best. Keep trash, mundane items and non-period items out of view.

Amp it up – demos are a time for all the forsooth language, flowery actions, and poetry you have. Be the dream, indulge in the ideals.

Do not sell items. While there are many wonderful merchants in the SCA who sell items many of us desperately need, the first thing a person hears about the SCA should not be a sales pitch. We are a non-profit, educational organization. The SCA is not personally affiliated with your business. If you hand out business cards or merchant at a demo, people will believe that you are a) official and b) that they have to buy things or use or business to be involved. This is inappropriate and could cause you and the SCA headaches down the road.

Make sure the information you have on hand is accurate and that you have plenty of it. Print out handouts and business cards in advance. The SCA website has plenty of pre-written handouts that look great. The Atlantian Chatelain's Handbook also has some templates. If a local member wants to write one, great, but please have the seneschal ok it first to make sure it meets Society standards. Have some photo albums so people can see the variety the SCA offers. Have people available who want to talk and answer questions.

Be hands on! After a few stories, people can get bored. It is fun to watch a tourney but even that becomes too boring after a few hours. Have activities that your guests can try and participate in. In this day and age of computer games and internet and social networking, people want something they can do. Keep your displays varied. Even if the majority of your group is into one thing, have other options that people can learn about. Variety is the spice of life.

Have a sign-up sheet/contact list for people who are interested in more info and then follow up on those people. Don't expect people to hunt you down. Give people the info they need and show them how to get involved.

After the demo, get feedback from your event host/site host. See what they felt you did well and what you could improve. Remember to thank them for allowing you to participate. Also, thank your volunteers. Everyone who helps at a demo is doing you and your local group a favor, thank them for their assistance.

## Karagöz & Hacivat or Turkish Shadow Plays

The Ottomans loved dramatic performance and puppets.





One of the most popular is now called the Karagöz or shadow play and has a long tradition in the Ottoman Empire. The Ottoman writer and chronicler, Evliya Celebi said the first Karagöz show was performed in the palace for Sultan Bayezid in the late 1300's. More modern chroniclers say the shadow plat tradition came from Egypt and that the first shadow play was performed for Sultan Selim II after he conquered the Mamelukes. This story says that a shadow player did a play showing how Selim II hung the Mamluk Sultan and Selim liked it so much, he brought the man to Istanbul. Other researches have said the tradition came from Spain or the Gypsies, or even from the Java shadow plays! No matter how it actually arrived, the Ottomans took the tradition and made it their own. In Turkish, they became known as zill-I hayal or imaginary shadows.

Another urban legend about the Karagöz plays that explains the name is that during the time of Orhan (14<sup>th</sup> Century), a mosque was being built but it was taking much longer than planned. The Sultan became enraged and demanded to know why it was moving so slow. It was reported that two builders, a Karagöz, a blacksmith, and Hacivad, a stonemason, were distracting all the workers with their silly jokes and funny wit. The Sultan had the two men executed and the mosque completed but the people of the city missed the two men so much, an artisan made images of them from cow-hide and began to give puppet shows. These shows were performed on the street and they became so popular, every started doing them.

In the modern plays, Hacivat is always the educated, upper class character, who is obsessed with order and tradition. He wants what is best for others but cannot look beyond his education and status. He is well respected but trapped in his role. Karagöz is an uneducated but sensible, lower class worker who often wins the day because his common sense and humor. He is not respected but understands the way the world works.

The plays were performed in private houses, in the palaces, and at festivals. The themes of the plays often were about social or moral responsibilities, especially when performed during Ramadan. The play contains four parts: the mukaddime or the introduction; the muhavere or the dialogue; the fasil or main plot; and the bittis or conclusion.

After a prayer, the show beings with the mukaddime, when Hacivat enters the stage, moving to some music. He then sings a song (the semai). After that, he calls for his friend Karagöz and the show really begins. Like the English Punch and Judy shows, there is almost always a fight and a battle of wits between the two (with double meanings and bawdy jokes). There are several stock characters that can appear during the show to further the story or just provide comic relief. There is

often a drunk, a dwarf, a miser, a loose woman, sweet sellers, merchants, and so on.

Generally these shows are done by one puppeteer and an apprentice, though there might be a few singers or musicians that play during the show, so the quality and variety of stories vary quite widely. The shows done in private houses and cafes tended to be more crude and bawdy, while the ones at the palace or religious festivals were more sedate and educational.

Even today, the Karagöz plays are still popular and are often done during public festival days or at schools.
