Baronial Clerk Signet

The position involves: Working with the Baron and Baroness for scroll assignments / awards, working with the other scribes of the Barony for handling assignments, working with the MOAS for planning scroll competitions at events, and working with the Baronial Herald.

Minister of the Lists

Minister of the List is a position within the Marshal structure to organize and document tournaments, record fighter authorizations and report the results in an unbiased fashion.

A Minister of the List (MoL) helps organize, complete and maintain the paperwork needed to track fighters' authorizations and run combat scenarios at events. They are the people sitting at the table on the side of the list field signing in combatants, checking authorization cards, recording authorizations, and filling out all those lovely forms necessary to keep fighting in Atlantia running smoothly.

Deputy Exchequer

The exchequer serves as the group treasurer. Becoming a deputy is a good way to learn how the office works! Being deputy does NOT mean you are required to become exchequer of the barony in the future, so check it out!

Deputy Seneschal

A seneschal in the Society for Creative Anachronism is an administrative officer and the modern equivalent of a president or chief operating officer. Again, being deputy is a great way to learn how the office works, you are not required to step up to seneschal in the future if you are the deputy.

Greetings Everyone,

I present to you one possible option for SSBB next year which is my bid for Sacred Stone Baronial Birthday 2025/Celebration of Mehregan. Some background, but the Mehregan is the Zoroastrian Yazata (Diety) Mithra who is the representation of light, affection, love, and friendship. Mehregan is normally celebrated during the fall equinox, but as our traditional time for SSBB falls slightly before it-I would recommend this as our own harvest festival and celebration recognizing the transition from summer to fall.

"During Mehregan, participants wear new clothes and set a colorful table adorned with dry wild marjoram, the holy book Avesta, a mirror, rose water, sweets, flowers, fruits (especially pomegranates and apples), and nuts. Silver coins and senjed seeds are placed in marjoram water, and a burner for kondor (frankincense) and espand (rue seeds) is included."

I can see this being a huge A&S festival celebrating culture, music, art and food which is exactly how this is celebrated in present day Iran. I would love to recognize the influence Her Excellency has had on me and I would be thrilled to make this event she is sure to remember before the Investiture in 2026. I look forward to hearing from you after the holidays on this bid and thank you for your time.

<u>Arts and Science Highlight - Lord Edward Perry</u>



I am currently dipping my toes into the water in the area of Arts and Sciences beginning tomorrow at Grit Wars in Apex, NC.

I will be presenting a historic interpretation and documentation included here for corn pudding as part of the "Corny Cuisine Competition" tomorrow. Update (November 10, 2024): I was the winner of the competition!

US Southern Corn Pudding vs British Hasty Pudding

Since I was a young boy, my mother and her mother before her and so on, made corn pudding every year for Thanksgiving. When I was a child I always thought it tasted like dessert more than a side dish. Although, as I got older I eventually figured out that it was almost no different than the cornbread stuffing my mother and grandmother made-only more sweet instead of savory. Needless to say, I decided to do a little comparison study of where corn pudding got its roots and how it compares with earlier medieval and recipes from the 1600's. Borrowing from food journalist Lauren Thompson (2024):

Hasty pudding, a grain-based dessert, originated in Europe and evolved into an American staple during colonial times. This delectable dish is made by stirring cornmeal or wheat flour with milk or water to create a thick batter with a porridge-like consistency. The name "hasty pudding" comes from its fast cooking time compared to other pudding recipes. Hasty pudding has been consumed since the 16th century and its origins can be traced back to the Middle Ages when similar dishes were cooked over a fire. It has *British* roots but was adapted by American settlers, who used ground corn instead of flour. This grain-based dessert is typically served warm and can be topped with *ice cream or whipped cream*, adding a delightful touch to its comforting taste.

In addition to its basic recipe, hasty pudding also has variations such as *Indian pudding*, flavored with *molasses*, *ginger*, *and nutmeg*. The recipe for hasty pudding was first published in a cookbook called "The Accomplisht Cook" by Robert May in 1660 in England. Since then,

this humble dish has gained popularity and become a cherished part of *American culinary* heritage (pg.1).

In 1643, puritan Roger Williams called the dish Nasaump and in 1747 Hannah Glasse mentioned it as a term for porridge in her book the Art of Cookery (Wikipedia, n.d.).

Historians tend to believe that hasty pudding or Indian pudding was made using "green corn" or immature corn ears that haven't fully dried as taught to American colonists;

sometimes the corn was cooked in its husk before shucking it (we also called this roasting)

(196flavors.com, n.d.). Nowadays, hasty pudding is much more complex in flavor profile with the addition of butter and maple syrup, but it is still cooked in the same fast-boiling method using cornmeal and water/milk to thicken it which is what early American colonists used as sustenance during the early 1700's-1800's (What's Cooking America, n.d.).

So how does this relate to modern corn pudding? Well recipes tend to change and develop over time to reflect those in the past. As corn recipes became more complex and passed from one generation to another-unique touches were used to make the recipe more flavorful or hearty. Corn pudding is simple a whole and cream-corn based derivative of hasty pudding with almost the exact same ingredients. "The main difference is the texture. Corn pudding has a similar gelatinous texture to dessert pudding, hence its name, so it's creamy and loose. In comparison, corn casserole has a thicker consistency and holds its shape better than the pudding because it uses thickening agents like instant cornbread mix. Both use similar ingredients including a variation of corn, usually either creamed corn or fresh,

frozen, or canned kernels — but, of course, every recipe is a little different" (Havens-Bowen, 2024).

While corn pudding is the modern interpretation of hasty pudding using whole and cream-style corn, the addition of spices and accoutrements still make both dishes important as a cultural culinary icon of the early colonists in the United States. Both pay homage to our ancestors and their relationships (albeit eventually tyrannical) with the first American Indians encountered. Hasty pudding is literally a part of our musical past "the pudding's consistency is nodded to in the song "Yankee Doodle": "and here we saw the men and boys/as thick as hasty puddin'." But the stuff probably reached its cultural peak in Joel Barlow's mock epic "The Hasty Pudding." a 1793 celebration of cornmeal mush and a literary declaration of independence. Barlow began his poem by addressing "my morning incense, and my evening meal-/The Sweets of Hasty Pudding. Come, dear bowl,/Glide o'er my palate, and inspire my soul (Wills, 2016)."

In partnership with my mother, we will be making both a historic hasty pudding recipe and a more modern corn pudding recipe. Photographs and the recipe will be included in this report, but for the hasty pudding I am using a recipe from Cookist located here:

The Corn pudding recipe, however, is listed here:

☐ 1 can Whole Kernel Corn 15 oz drained	How to Make Corn Pudding
2 cans Cream Style Corn 15 oz each	You'll find the full, step-by-step recipe below —
5 large Eggs	but here's a brief overview of what you can expect when you make this old-fashioned corn
1/3 cup Butter melted and cooled	pudding casserole:
☐ ½ cup Granulated Sugar	1. Whisk the eggs, then whisk in the milk,
☐ ½ cup Milk whole or 2%	butter, sugar, and cornstarch. 2. Stir in the drained canned whole kernel corn
4 Tbsp Cornstarch	and cream-style corn.
□ 1 tsp Salt ♥	Pour mixture into the prepared casserole dish and bake until golden brown.

My observations of cooking both recipes is that the hasty pudding seems more of a porridge or soup rather than the corn pudding, which honestly looks more like runny stuffing. Of course there is more liquid content in hasty pudding because it is cornmeal boiled in milk until the milk mostly evaporates into congealed solids. However, the corn pudding is a thicker consistency with the moisture content of the creamed corn making the dish taste both soft and delicate as opposed to runny. Hasty pudding obviously requires less cooking time and sets up faster than corn pudding, but both dishes shared the fact that there were very few ingredients needed to make the dish. Granted, you can add garnishes and even include various spices into the recipe, but the simplest version is the most accurate and is still nourishing in context to what early Americans ate. Overall, I believe it is important to learn the story behind what makes our favorite family dishes worth making and celebrating. I am looking forward to another historical dish as we finish up the year with SCA events.
